

What is the same? – Uniform

Lunch & Snacks.



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- The school will continue to use the existing catering company
- Meals will cost £2.05
- Orders must be in by midnight the day before.
- Fruit or vegetables can be brought in for a break time snack.
- Please bring in a <u>named</u> bottle of water for your child. This should be in addition to your child's lunchtime drink and should stay for the whole week to be brought home on a Friday.
- Packed lunches eat in the classroom when weather is wet and playground when warm and dry.
- School dinners eat in dining area.



Timings

 Children can arrive between 8:40 – 8:50. If they arrive after 9:00 they should enter the school through the office.

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- Children who arrive after the registration period will be marked as late.
- Children are not to enter the school before 8:40 please.
- They are also not permitted to wait around on site before 8:40.
- On arrival at school the children are to go straight to class to begin their morning work.
- Lunch is at 12.15 1.15
- Home-time is 3.15pm with collection from the junior playground.

- Morning Break: 10:30- 10.50am
- Lunchtime: 12:15-1:15pm
- Home time: 3:15pm

Children are not permitted to walk home on their own in Lower Juniors.

When a parent/carer is late – the child will be taken to the office, the parent will be phoned and the child will then wait to be collected from the reception area. If your child is to be picked up by another parent on a regular basis, please let the school office know.

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As you can appreciate, your children's safety is of upmost importance so we do not let 'friends' take children home when a parent is late unless we have prior permission. Please inform the office or your class teacher if your child will be picked up by someone other than a parent or guardian.

Home Time. – 3:15pm

 Children are dismissed and are to be met in the Junior playground by carer.

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- It is appreciated if distance could be kept from the classrooms at the end of the day as this is a busy time of day and the children need to remain focused.
- Playground equipment is not to be used after school and children must walk their scooters or bikes across the playground when leaving the site.

Reading in school...

Reading is as crucial in the juniors as it is in KS1.

 Different colour bands, children are listened to and put on to the most appropriate level for them.

...and reading at home

• We expect our children to read at home five times a week: develops fluency and understanding.

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- Even if your child is an independent/fluent reader, it is still crucial for them to have opportunities to read their school book to an adult and discuss the texts which they are reading.
- So...please take time to establish a reading routine at home.
- Home school diary:
 - Weekly pages: Reading log, messages
 - Front: key skills for your child's year group
 - Back: spelling list for LKS2, usernames/passwords,
 - Teacher will sign weekly.
- If a child does not complete their reading and have their diary signed they will have the opportunity to stay and read in a break time.

Maths

- Work is always differentiated.
- Practical maths.
- Money is an excellent way to make maths relevant.
- Problem solving.
- Practise at home, e.g. cooking, shopping, telling the time.

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- Group work, playing with number.
- Computing Use of technology to motivate. Children particularly enjoy competitive challenge! – Sumdog, Times table Rockstars
- The Time Table Check is a Government Assessment in June 2020 which will test the children's knowledge of times tables.
- Work to achieve the Non Negotiables

Maths


Times tables are an important part of maths education.

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- The expectation is that by the end of year 3 the children know the 3, 4 and 8 times tables, in addition to the 2, 5 and 10s from KS1.
- By June of year 4 the expectation is that they know their full set of times tables to 12 x 12.
- The learning of these times tables will be reflected in the home learning planned for your child.
- There will be testing that replicates the times table check throughout the year.

- Members of staff are in the playground before school to take any important messages or answer day-to-day queries.


The Lower Juniors – Home

 The home learning your child receives will include: 5 x a week reading to an adult; a short comprehension task; computer maths (MyMaths); spellings.


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- The homework will be given on a Thursday and should be returned by Tuesday the following week.
- If home learning is not complete the children will be required to complete it in school during break or lunch.
