

- "I think they need more homework in terms of variety and challenge."

- "Term long projects more creatively challenging work"
- "Helping to boost motivation by offering credits for completed work, extra effort, most original etc."
- "Vary the activities more frequently."
- "Varied homework e.g weekend diary entry, topic based which could invole research for example"
