Funds raised last academic year were £12,201.90 being split 60/40, 60% going towards the main hall refurbishment and 40% towards all other items school needs. # Curriculum News

## Foundation Stage:

All of the foundation staff have been very impressed with how well the children have settled in to school life at Woodley C of E! We have had a busy few weeks getting to know the children and finding out what their interests are. We noticed that the children were really engaged in making cakes and cookies with the playdough so decided to move their interest forward by making real cookies! The children loved looking through the recipe book to find one they liked. We looked at the ingredients that we would need and some children even wrote me a list to take to the shops! They were so excited when I brought the shopping back after lunch. We then had great fun making and decorating our biscuits. The children have been really interested in superhero play this week so we have making dens for our superheroes to live. The children have thoroughly enjoyed this and lots of great team work has been observed!



This week we have started our phonics sessions. We will be updating Tapestry each day with the sound that we have been learning. You can use the phonics cards that we gave out in the new parent meeting to support your child with their phonics at home. If you need any help with this then one of the foundation team would be very happy to help you.

Tapestry – Thank you to all of the parents that have returned their forms and activated their accounts. If you have not yet done so or are experiencing any problems then please come and speak to one of the foundation team who can help. It is really important that every parent has an active account that is viewed regularly as we will be posting updates on what we have been learning at school. Thank you to all of those parents that have added observations from home, we have loved reading through them all. PE – Willow and Chestnut will have PE on a Friday. Please ensure that your child's PE kit is in school on that day. Tissues and wet wipes – as the cold season is almost amongst us we would really appreciate any donations of tissues and wet wipes. ## Key Stage 1:

This half term, our topic in KS1 is 'Marvellous Me'. The children are learning about their own history and have already begun to make personal timelines of their lives. They have also looked at other timelines to help them to understand vocabulary such as 'a long time ago' or 'recently' etc. In geography, the children have been learning about Reading Town and comparing it to Bournemouth. They are learning vocabulary to do with coasts and other geographical features of these places. We will also be looking at cities and the countryside. Towards the end of half term, we will be looking at how humans look like their families in many features. For this we will need your family pictures in ASAP. Thank you to everyone who has already returned them.

In art, we are studying Picasso. The children have been adding white and black to make colours lighter and darker. We will soon make our abstract facial features to add on! In RE, we are learning about the Christian Creation story about how God created the world in seven days. The children will be thinking about our big question: Does God want Christians to look after the world? Plenty of opportunity for philosophical discussions!

Show and Tell is on the last Friday of each half term. As we have an INSET day on the last Friday before half term, Show and Tell will be on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> October. The children can bring something special to do with our topic or something which celebrates an achievement. They can bring a favourite book, photo or something they have made. They cannot bring in toys! Please help your child to prepare something which they want to say about their item.

We have all been pleased with how many parents are now signing their children's diaries five times a week. We feel very strongly that reading with our children encourages them to develop a life-long love of reading. We hope you will all join us for the home learning launch – some exciting changes are coming!

# Curriculum News

## Lower Key Stage 2: (Years 3&4)

The Lower Juniors have started the year very positively and we are impressed with how well the children have settled in. We spent the first week getting to know each other and learning or reminding ourselves of the expectations in the Lower Juniors. We have also been learning how we can help each other to have a Growth Mindset when we learn – if we change our words, we can change our mindset!

Our topic this term has a Geography theme of 'Water World' and we are exploring rivers of England, as well as focussing on the River Thames in topic, learning how to use Google maps and an atlas.

In English we have been exploring the story of Lila and the Secret of rain, re-telling the story with expression and intonation. We have re-acquainted ourselves with the Grammar Gang to help us understand nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs. We have been challenging ourselves to use effective examples of these when developing our descriptive settings and characters, ready to write our own story. We've even created a conscious alley to help us 'feel' the atmosphere before we write.

Place value and addition have been our focus in Maths and we are challenging ourselves to be able to explain our answers or use our knowledge to solve problems. We have also enjoyed progressing through the addition challenge cards – we have a great sense of achievement when we change our mindset and get sums right we didn't think we could do!

In Art, we are practising how to sketch in readiness for creating a water scene, using Dinton Pastures as our inspiration. We are all looking forward to visiting the River and Rowing Museum in Henley in a couple of weeks to learn more about rivers.

Finally, thank you for the amazing effort in reading with your children. They are very excited to be getting a Class Dojo for every time they read – please remember to sign the diaries as often as you hear your child read!

## Upper Key Stage 2: (Years 5&6)

From the start of the term, the Upper Juniors have immersed themselves in the autumn topic of 'Powers and Poppies' – a history focus on WW1. We have talked about how the Great War started and compared a map of Europe then with a map of Europe today.

In English, we are reading 'War Horse' by Michael Morpurgo. Our diary writing, letters and internal monologues have all been written from different points of view and centered on the moving events of Joey and his different owners.

In art, we have all been inspired by Kandinsky, one of the founders of abstract art. We enjoyed using the stimulus of music to create our own pieces – moving whilst painting was a new experience for some. ***"I could hear the hiss of the colours as they mingled."*** Vassily Kandinsky.

We developed our painting skills using water colours and other media and our final 'original' art work would look great in any gallery.

Science started the term with fun bubble investigations and has now moved on to exploring the different properties of materials. We thought about the conditions soldiers would have endured in the trenches and looked at materials best suited to make their equipment. We also investigated the best methods to make different materials waterproof and found wax to be very effective.

Hinduism is our focus in RE. We have discussed how Hindus show commitment to God and have looked at the different objects of the Puja, which was fascinating.

As well as all the above, we have looked at place value and some challenging calculations in maths, talked about our Bright learning focus for this term - being brave and our core value of Love.

It has been a busy start to the term – and Year 6 still have Little Canada to look forward to.....
