

email enlarged print audio Woodley CofE School children have an excellent reputation for looking smart in their uniform. We are proud of our children and hope that you will help us maintain this high standard as it is important that your child is dressed appropriately and smartly at all times.

Our school uniform:

Children

Knee length grey or black skirt or grey or black pinafore dress

Long grey or black trousers or grey or black knee length shorts

Knee length Summer red and white checked dress

White or red polo shirt **or** short or long-sleeved white shirt

Red school cardigan or jumper (with school logo preferred)

Black, grey or white socks (no trainer socks)

Red, black or grey tights

Sensible black shoes (leather or leather effect) which provide a good grip and fasten securely. No open toed sandals, boots or canvas shoes.

Plain black trainers (in place of school shoes if preferred).

PE Kit

Plain white T-shirt (school logo optional)

Plain red or black shorts

Plain grey or black tracksuit bottoms (winter)

Plain grey or black sweatshirt, no hoodies, zips or pockets (winter)

Trainers (not plimsolls)

PE kit should be worn into school on designated PE days. Children remain in their PE kit all day and do not need to bring school uniform to change into. Children should wear their school jumper or cardigan and bring their additional warmer layer for outside PE. Shorts should be worn under tracksuit bottoms so that bottoms can be removed if PE is indoors and the children do not overheat.

Jewellery should not be worn in school. If a child has pierced ears, plain gold or silver studs only should be worn. For safety, these have to be removed during PE. If children are unable to remove their earrings without adult help, please do not send them into school with earrings on PE days. If the earrings cannot be removed for up to six weeks after piercing, please provide protective tape to be applied for PE lessons.

Extreme hairstyles are not acceptable in school and only natural colours are suitable for the children. Please support us in this by not allowing your child to attend school with inappropriate hairstyles and colours. Hair accessories; slides, scrunches and bands are to be red, black, grey or white and long hair must be tied back at all times. All make-up, including nail varnish should not be worn to school. Temporary tattoos are also unacceptable.

It is important that ALL of your children's belongings are clearly named. Each term we collect an enormous quantity of un-named items, many of which are almost new.

All types of shirt are to be tucked in at all times. In the event of hot weather, the Head Teacher may make the decision, on a day to day basis, to allow the children to leave their shirts untucked.
